



Yue Leon Guo, M.D., M.P.H., PH.D., is a distinguished professor in Environmental and Occupational Medicine, School of Medicine, National Taiwan University (NTU), and an attending physician in NTU Hospital. He is also an honorary affiliate of Woolcock Institute of Medical Research, University of Sydney.

He obtained his medical degree from National Taiwan University, Master of Public Health from Harvard School of Public Health, and PHD in Environmental Health and Occupational Medicine from Johns Hopkins University. He served residency in Internal Medicine in Texas Tech University Health Science Center, Lubbock, Texas, and residency in Occupational Medicine in University of California at San Francisco. He became a faculty member in Medical School, National Cheng Kung University in 1990. In 2006 he became a faculty member in Medical School of National Taiwan University (NTU), until now. He served during 2016-9 as a distinguished investigator and the director the National Institute of Environmental Health Science (NIEHS), National Health Research Institutes (NHRI), Taiwan. He was the president of Asian Congress of Occupational Health (2000-2002). He became a fellow of the Collegium Ramazzini in 2011, which is an international honorary society accommodating only 180 scholars globally. His research interest has been on health effects caused by environmental agents such as air pollutants, allergens, climate change, and endocrine disrupting chemicals. Prediction of health outcomes such as atopic eczema and asthma has been developed. He headed a long-term study on health effects caused by direct or prenatal heavy exposure to polychlorinated biphenyls and related chemicals. The research works resulted in more than 320 international papers and 10 book chapters.
